

Bible Study: How the New Testament Repeats Old Testament Commandments

1. Love Yahuah with All Your Heart

Old Testament: Deuteronomy 6:5 - 'Love Yahuah your Elohim with all your heart, soul, and strength.'

New Testament: Matthew 22:37 - Yahusha said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind.'

2. Love Your Neighbor as Yourself

Old Testament: Leviticus 19:18 - 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'

New Testament: Matthew 22:39 - 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'

3. Do Not Murder

Old Testament: Exodus 20:13 - 'You shall not murder.'

New Testament: Matthew 5:21-22 - 'You have heard... You shall not murder... But I say to you that everyone who is angry... will be liable to judgment.'

4. Do Not Commit Adultery

Old Testament: Exodus 20:14 - 'You shall not commit adultery.'

New Testament: Matthew 5:27-28 - 'You have heard... You shall not commit adultery... But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lust... has already committed adultery in his heart.'

5. Honor Your Parents

Old Testament: Exodus 20:12 - 'Honor your father and your mother.'

New Testament: Matthew 15:4 - 'For God said, Honor your father and mother...' (Yahusha quoting the commandment)

6. Keep the Commandments

Old Testament: Deuteronomy 11:1 - 'You shall therefore love Yahuah your God and keep His charge, His statutes, His rules, and His commandments always.'

New Testament: John 14:15 - 'If you love me, keep my commandments.'

7. Do Not Steal

Old Testament: Exodus 20:15 - 'You shall not steal.'

New Testament: Romans 13:9 - 'The commandments... You shall not steal... are summed up in this word: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'

8. Do Not Bear False Witness

Old Testament: Exodus 20:16 - 'You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.'

New Testament: Colossians 3:9 - 'Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self.'
