Show Yourself Approved Unto Yahuah vs Grace Only Doctrine

2 Timothy 2:15 (Restored Name Version):

"Study to show yourself approved unto Yahuah, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of Truth."

This scripture calls for diligence, learning, and obedience. It reveals that Yahuah requires more than belief—He desires effort and righteousness.

Contrast: 'Grace Only' Doctrine in Christianity

Many churches today teach that grace alone is sufficient for salvation. This belief often comes from:

Ephesians 2:8-9:

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man should boast."

However, verse 10 is often overlooked:

Ephesians 2:10:

"For we are His workmanship, created in Messiah Yahusha unto good works, which Yahuah hath before ordained that we should walk in them."

Key Biblical Principles:

- Yahuah expects His people to study, grow, and obey His Word (Torah).
- Grace is a gift to cover our past sins—not a license to ignore commandments.
- Obedience and works show our faith in action (James 2:17: 'Faith without works is dead').
- True belief in Yahusha includes following His example—keeping the commandments.

Conclusion:

Grace is real and powerful, but it does not replace the need for obedience. Yahuah's people are called to be diligent, faithful, and righteous—studying and living according to His Word.
