

Yahusha vs Jesus - Two Different Teachings

This chart shows the contrast between Yahusha, the true Hebrew Messiah who taught obedience to Yahuah's commandments, and Jesus, the Greco-Roman figure often associated with lawless doctrines.

Yahusha (True Hebrew Messiah)	Jesus (Greco-Roman Creation)
Came in His Father's Name - Yahusha means "Yahuah is salvation" (John 5:43)	Name 'Jesus' came from Latin Iesus, not tied to the Father's Name
Kept and taught the Torah (Law) (Matt 5:17-19)	Often taught as having abolished the Law (misinterpreted Matt 5:17)
Commanded obedience to the Father's commandments (John 14:15, Matt 19:17)	Followers are often told 'the law is done away with' by grace
Observed the Sabbath, Passover, and all Biblical Feasts	Replaced with Sunday worship, Easter, and Christmas
Warned of lawlessness (Matt 7:21-23 - 'depart from Me, you workers of lawlessness')	Portrayed as allowing sin through grace without obedience
Taught to follow the Father's will (Matt 7:21)	Some teachings suggest His will replaces the Father's
Fulfills prophecy as the Torah-keeping Messiah	Christianity often teaches faith alone, without Torah, is enough
